In the old days, when a fire engine horse was retired, it took a long time before the veteran puller would stop reacting to the fire alarm. Some never stoyyed.

Probably the high-pitched scream of a jet aircraft engine starting up will have the same effect on Herb Stancil, veteran air transportation industry employee, who retired last week from Trans World Airlines.

Stancil, in an aviation career that has spanned nearly half a century, chalked up 37 years with TWA. Although he has been in the "white collar" end of the business for the past many years, he knows the greasy end of the business too. He is proud of the fact that he started in aviation as a grease-monkey and still is a qualified mechanic.

During his years in the business he has seen single-engine small transports replaced by huge 600-mile-per-hour jets carrying passenger load which even the most optimistic dreamer wouldn't have predicted back in the 1930s. He has been a part of the rapid, even fantastic, growth of TWA and the rest of the industry.

John Thomas Stancil dies 100 years ago

John Thomas Stancil started the Stancil Family Reunion at his homeplace off Glendale Road in late 1902.

He wanted to create the Stancil Family Reunion as a way to reunite his adult children in one place after going some time apart. And after months of planning, the entire family -- plus some extras -- did all make it back home.

Tom was born Jan. 23, 1841, in Johnston County, N.C. He was the son of Martha Patsy Rentfrow of Lucama and Samuel Stancil of the Stancil's Chapel area of Johnston County, N.C.

He died 100 years ago on Jan. 27, 1922, in Johnston County. Here are memories passed long by grandson George Ralph Stancil.



John Thomas Stancil's tobacco barn was built in the early 1900s.

John Thomas Stancil died on a cold, snowy Friday, in the old original Stancil Homestead. He'd given it to his son, George Ira. Thomas was surrounded by family. He had been sick for a time. Sam, his son who lived in Wilson County, often came and sat up with him. John Thomas had a high fever for several days. Ralph recalls water being put on his grandpa's parched lips.

Neighbors were notified after his death. Jarvis Woodward and other men gathered to dig the grave. Jarvis was the grandson of Lucinda Hales Atkinson, Tom's half sister. The ground was frozen on top and it was one of the coldest days anyone could remember. The neighborhood men built fires to help warm their hands. They still had to frequently return to the house to warm up.

The coffin and burial box was built by Tommy Crockrell and his son-in-law George Hodge (who married his daughter Molly). The coffin and burial box was built out

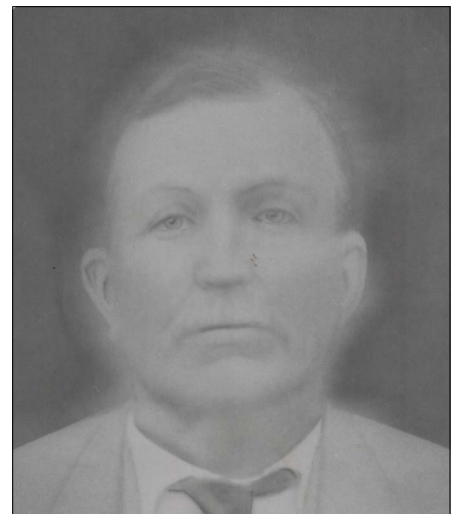

of heart pine. The boards for the lid must have been designed to slide on because Ralph does not recall seeing or hearing any hammering. It is believed that the wide heart pine boards were on hand at the George Ira Stancil farm. Large pines once covered most of the farm. The coffin was lined with a light colored fabric. The fabric was tacked in place.

Stephen Boyette dressed John Thomas for burial in his finest suit. Stephen was assisted by George Hodge and Tommy Crockrell.

Stephen was one of Delanie's cousins. His mother was her aunt. Ralph recalls Stephen T. Boyette holding his grandpa's mouth together for a period of time. John Thomas was laid out the first night after his death on his bed with a sheet covering him.

He was put in the coffin the next day. The burial was Saturday afternoon and it was very cold, sleeting and snowing.

His son George Ira wanted to delay the burial until all his brothers were present. It was decided that the burial must go on, because the terrible weather would probably keep Joe from attending. Joe arrived just after the burial because of the weather. Joe lived close to Rains Crossroads which was about 10 miles away.

The pall bearers carried the coffin out to the graveyard. The Stancil Graveyard was established in 1907 when Thomas Ruffin Stancil died in a hunting accident. The sons and grandsons followed the coffin. The sons present were: Henry, Sam, John Archer, Alvin, Harvey and George. The grandsons present as recalled by Ralph were: Clyde, Walter, Oscar, Elbert, Arthur and Emmette. There were no women present at the burial. Granddaughters at the house included: Effie, Rachel, Mamie, Vazelle, Myrtle, Hilda, Bessie, Elizabeth, Agnes and Ila. The coffin was lowered into the grave. There was no preacher present and Ralph does not recall any ceremony at all, not even a prayer. The grave was immediately covered with dirt.

Joe arrived soon after the burial, with his wife Minnie and children: Willie, Leafy and Mozelle. Joe had loaded his truck with hay,

so it would make the trip. The extra weight kept the tires from spinning. Joe understood why the burial took place without him. Later in the afternoon the weather cleared, and there was a beautiful sunset. Joe and his family spent the night at George Ira Stancil's. Everyone was always glad to see Minnie. She was fun to be around, totally entertaining. Minnie was an excellent cook and great help to all her sister-in-laws.

John Thomas's son John Archer gave the details of his pa's death to Johnston County Officials and so

did Arthur Stancil. Two different death dates were given and two different burials. J.A. Stancil said he died on Jan. 27, 1922, and Arthur said he died Jan. 28, 1922. John Thomas Stancil was said to have been 81 years, and four days at his death. He was born Jan. 23, 1841.

George Ira was the executor of the estate. Several canceled checks in the settlement of Tom's estate have survived.

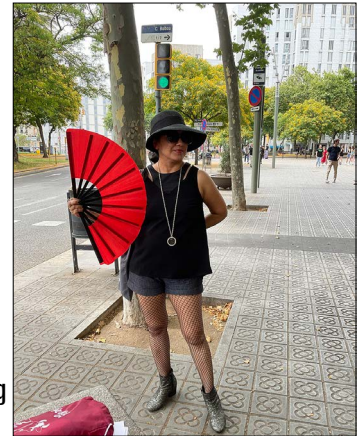

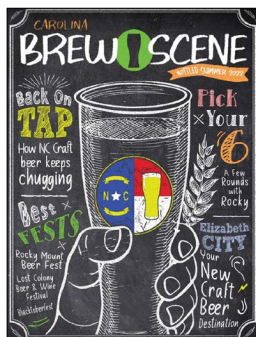

A Look Back | 60 years ago

This article was originally printed in The Smithfield Herald on Sept. 4, 1962:

J. T. Stancil Family Reunion Held in the Glendale Community

The annual Stancil reunion, which began in 1903, was held Sunday, Sept. 2, 1962, at the old homeplace of John Thomas and Delanie Sasser Stancil in the Glendale Community with about 125 in attendance.

The farm was homesteaded about 1800 in three separate land grants by William Sasser and totaled between 300 and 400 acres. It is all still owned by his descendants, grandsons of John Thomas and Delanie Sasser Stancil: George Garland Stancil, Donell Stancil, Glenn Stancil, Thomas Emmette Stancil, and George Ira Stancil Jr.

Children of John Thomas Stancil were Henry, Samuel, Josiah, Tempie Ann Hill, John Archer, Arnettie Hill, Alvin, Harvey, and George Ira. Most of these, all deceased, were represented at the reunion. The only living widow, Mrs. Esther Peedin Stancil, was present.

All living children of George Ira Stancil attended: George Ralph from Ocala, Fla., Dorothy Dennison of Philadelphia, Pa., Mamie Carraway of Farmville, Myrtle Eason of Wilson, Vazelle Jesup of Hertford, Emmette Stancil, G.I. Stancil and Mrs. Rachel Renfrow of Lucama, Mrs. Hilda Hales of Fremont, and Mrs. Delanie Stancil of Middlesex. The youngest son, Harold Lloyd, was killed in World War II serving in the Navy on Oct. 13, 1944.

Traveling the greatest distance to attend the reunion was great-granddaughter Georgeanne Stancil Schore, her husband Glenn, and infant son Teddy of Chicago,
