





Marvelene was born, Oct. 21, 1937, on the top floor of a grocery near Moore School House, Johnston County, NC, to Wilbert and Mayzell Boykin Hill. She was a granddaughter of Arnettie Stancil Hill. She was 11 months younger than Imogene.

In 1942, the family moved to Onslow County. Wilbert worked in the rock quarry. They mined limestone, sand and gravel. Bears, water moccasins and rattlers were plentiful. For fun, Marvelene and Toot sat on a wagon, held the tongue, raced it down a rock quarry hill, crossing the road. What a thrill!

They moved with Wilbert's job; four times one year. Marvelene, barely in her teens, worked tobacco for \$.25 per hour. Money went to her pa for rent. Later she worked in Kenly for \$.50 per hour and used money for school clothes.

Marvelene started 8th grade in Onslow County and finished in Guilford County. She quit school at 15 to help her mama at home with Toot, 13, Karen, 7, Sandra, 5, Liz, 4 and Linda, 1. A year later, Sharon was born, two years later, Debra was born.

Marvelene, met Woodrow "Woody" Franklin Murph. He drove a 1954 blue Bel Air Chevy and made good money at a bobbin factory. Attraction and love happened quickly. Several months later, Woody secretly arranged for his uncle, Rev. T. C. Davis, to marry them, Jan. 29, 1955. Marvelene wore a \$2.99 wool plaid dress, from Woolworths. Imogene went too.

They lived with Woody's parents, John and Ruby. Woody built a house ¾ mi. off the road, on his 12 acres. The house included a fireplace, front and back porches. Marvelene was

excited and proud.

Woody worked in town, Marvelene worked in the neighborhood, helping with tobacco. These were happy times. They welcomed son Frankie. Then Robin, Kip and Angie. She focused on her family.

At first, tobacco was farmed parttime then Woody quit his job, farmed full-time. Tobacco was a money crop, the risks and rewards were great. They battled droughts, worms and disease. Marvelene worked tirelessly. After years of scrimping, stretching every dollar, Marvelene and Woody realized that farming for profit eluded them. The stress was over-whelming. Bad luck struck. Woody sold the car, to buy a farm truck. Tragically it was totaled. They stopped farming, rented a house in Greensboro. By now the children were in school. Woody found work and a textile hosiery mill hired Marvelene. She was made supervisor and bought her first car, a '67 Mercury Capri. Woody and Marvelene drifted apart.

Marvelene supervised Bob Carico, a West Virginia Navy veteran. Both marriages were on the rocks. Neither sought a relationship, but in time, friendship turned to love.

Marvelene made a difficult decision. She left Woody, took the children to Virginia, filed for divorce. Woody sold the farm and sent her a settlement.

When the divorce was final, Marvelene had custody of the children. She married Robert "Bob" Edward Carico, in Dillon, S.C., Oct. 19, 1974. Her mother, Liz and her husband Milton, were witnesses. Marvelene and Bob found companionship, peace, security, kindness and love.

They moved to Atlantic Beach. Carteret Manufacturing Company, a builder of ship deck houses, hired Bob.

After Michael Lorne Carico was born, they moved to Eureka. Bob, a jack-of-all-trades, worked in tobacco, a garage, on a farm, drove water and asphalt trucks His dad was also a truck driver. A heart attack forced him to retire.

Bob, Marvelene's ray of sunshine, for almost 35 years, was the beloved, smiling, family jokester! Marvelene's children often said, "I know Bob's not my own daddy, but I could not love him more." Marvelene lost her best friend and soulmate when Bob died Oct. 7, 2009.
